The Clinton County Commission does hereby order the Zoning Administrator, Patricia J. Knight, as follows:  
Effective date of this Order, and in order to preserve the status quo and protect the health, safety, and  
welfare of Clinton County and its residents, no applications for a building permit, special use permit, zoning  
approval, or other authorization related to the siting, construction, or operation of Data Processing Centers,  
Data Centers, or similar high-intensity digital infrastructure facilities shall be accepted, processed,  
approved, or issued by Clinton County during the period of this Temporary Moratorium. This Temporary  
Moratorium is to allow the County sufficient time to review, study, and consider potential amendments to  
the Clinton County Zoning Order and related land use regulations concerning such facilities. This review  
may include, but is not limited to, consideration of the potential impacts on: Public infrastructure and  
utilities; Electrical demand and energy usage; Water usage and environmental impacts; Noise levels and  
nuisance concerns; Emergency services and public safety; Compatibility with surrounding land uses;  
Economic development and property values; and The general health, safety, and welfare of Clinton County  
residents. During the moratorium period, the County may conduct public hearings, receive public comment,  
consult with subject matter experts, and develop recommendations regarding appropriate regulations and  
zoning standards for such facilities. This Temporary Moratorium shall remain in full force and effect for a  
period of 365 days from the effective date of this Order unless terminated earlier by order of the County  
Commission or extended by further order of the County Commission if additional time is necessary to  
complete the review and consideration of proposed zoning amendments and regulations.

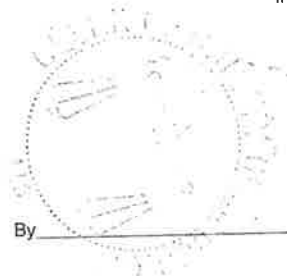
